Auburn Police Division Responds to Citizen Requests New Traffic Unit Patrolling City Streets

In response to citizen requests for more traffic patrols in the 2009 Citizen Survey, the Auburn Police Division created a new traffic unit to focus solely on traffic-related issues. In addition to regular patrols, two experienced patrol officers are now assigned full time to enforce traffic violations in business and residential areas, including speeding, seat belt use, school zone monitoring, rush hour problems, DUI enforcement, and other traffic concerns. The officers are assigned 12 hour shifts and are available during the heaviest traffic times of the day. Hours may be periodically adjusted to address special needs or situations.

Magnolia Avenue–Donahue Drive Intersection Improvements Completed



After much anticipation, the Magnolia Avenue - Donahue Drive Intersection Improvements Project was substantially completed in time for the beginning of Auburn University's fall semester in August. Improvements included the addition of left and right turn lanes at the intersection of Magnolia Avenue and Donahue Drive, resurfacing Magnolia Avenue from Gay Street to Donahue Drive, and sidewalk improvements. Stamped concrete crosswalks are tentatively scheduled for installation in late fall. Funding for the project, totaling more than \$1.4 million, was approved by Auburn voters earlier this year as part of the Special Five Mill Projects Referendum.

Based on input from citizens in the 2009 Citizen Survey, Auburn officials continue to make the management of traffic flow and congestion a top priority for improvement over the next two years. Several additional projects aimed at easing traffic flow are underway or were previously completed. Earlier this year, the extension of East Samford Avenue to East Glenn Avenue opened to traffic. Construction is nearing completion at Martin Luther King Jr. Drive/AL Highway 14 and Donahue Drive, and plans are currently underway to replace the North Donahue Drive Bridge and the Moores Mill Bridge, crossing Interstate 85. Citizens encouraged to attend public meetings for CompPlan 2030

The City of Auburn invites you to share your ideas for Auburn's future in a series of public meetings designed to give citizens a voice in the development of a new comprehensive plan for the City of Auburn. The first public meeting for CompPlan 2030 will be held on Tuesday, October 13 at a time and location to be determined. The meeting will begin with a presentation, followed by breakout groups where citizens will be able to offer input on this comprehensive plan for Auburn's future.

CompPlan 2030 is being developed to further the City of Auburn's mission to provide economical delivery of quality services, created and designed in response to the needs of its citizens, rather than by habit or tradition. The City of Auburn Planning Department seeks to accomplish this mission by encouraging that growth be well planned and managed, so that the result is an attractive and sustainable built environment where natural resources are protected and conserved.

As the future land use and transportation plan for the City of Auburn, CompPlan 2030 will focus on topics including land use, transportation systems, natural systems, schools, parks and recreation facilities, and utilities. The plan will make recommendations for Auburn's future based on community input, analysis of existing conditions, the Auburn Interactive Growth Model (AIGM), and the best practices of urban planning.

As part of Auburn's open government process, citizens are encouraged to participate in CompPlan 2030 and help determine the future of the Loveliest Village on the Plains. National League of Cities Prescription Discount Card Available October 1

The City of Auburn and the National League of Cities have partnered on a new program to help Auburn citizens save money on prescription medicines not covered by insurance. Beginning October 1, all Auburn citizens are eligible to receive a FREE prescription discount card that will enable them to save an average of 20% off the price of commonly prescribed medications at participating pharmacies. FEMA Floodplain Maps and Flood Insurance Study Update

90-Day Appeal and Protest Period Underway

Lee County and the City of Auburn are in the process of updating their Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Floodplain Maps and Flood Insurance Study. Property owners affected by the proposed floodplain have been notified by mail. FEMA has now initiated the 90-day appeal and protest period. Property owners interested in drafting an appeal or protest are encouraged to contact the City of Auburn Public Works Department prior to submitting their appeal. The 90-day period will end on November 2. The proposed maps are scheduled to go into effect in July 2010.

Make Your Presence Known...

Bicyclists, joggers, and pedestrians reminded to wear reflective gear

With 34 miles of bicycle and multi-use paths and over 75 miles of sidewalk, it's no wonder Auburn citizens enjoy seeking alternative routes of transportation such as bicycling and walking. When you're out biking, jogging, or walking, don't forget to think safety first.

The law requires pedestrians and joggers to wear reflective material between the waist and shoulders on the front and back of clothing/outerwear for maximum visibility. Make sure motorists can see you from a distance of at least 500 feet by wearing reflective clothing between the hours of 30 minutes before sunset until 30 minutes before sunrise. Cyclists are required to have an operating headlight on the front of their bicycle and reflectors on the front and rear spokes of the wheels and pedals.
